



Public Administration General Education Program

Students at Flagler College are required to complete specific groups of courses from a variety of fields to ensure exposure to different ideas and ways of thinking.

All students are required to complete two courses in English Composition (ENG 101 and ENG 102) and one course in Speech Communication (COM 101). In addition, students must demonstrate a sufficient level of skill and knowledge in the basic use of computers. This requirement may be satisfied by earning a passing grade in MIS 120 or a computer literacy course.

In addition to the requirements in English, communication, and computer literacy, students must complete a minimum of two courses in the humanities, two courses in the social sciences, two courses in mathematics at or above the 100 level, and one more course from any of the four groups of courses listed below.
